



INDUSTRIAL SAFETY AND RESCUE CASUALTY CARE COURSE

You work either in industry or provide specialist standby cover for high-risk activities on site. You have realised that the recommended First aid at work is not fit for purpose for the risks exposed by your risk assessment and method statements for the work.

What can you do?

This course follows the set syllabus suggested by the Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh and is equivalent to D on the pre-hospital emergency medicine training framework.

Course Aims – To give candidates the knowledge, skills and understanding necessary for them to respond as the initial emergency response to an industrial incident, and provide initial casualty care, prior to the arrival of the emergency services.

The course covers:

- **Adult CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation)**
- **Recovery Position**
- **Use of Airway Devices**
- **Use of Medical Oxygen (and when not to)**
- **Catastrophic Haemorrhage and Treatment**
- **Airway Problems**
- **Breathing Problems**
- **Wounds and Circulatory Issues**
- **Disability (Sprains, Strains and Fractures)**
- **Environmental Issues (Hot and Cold)**
- **Specific Workplace Issues (Work at Height)**
- **Specific Workplace Issues (Confined Spaces)**
- **Specific Workplace Issues (On, in or near Water)**
- **Specific Workplace Issues (Restricted Access/ Trenches)**
- **Specific Workplace Issues (Remote Areas)**
- **Immediate Rescue Techniques**

The course will enable delegates to:

- Provide Initial Immediate Care to Casualties in Industrial Surroundings while awaiting the arrival of the emergency services.
- Undertake resuscitation of casualties using cardiopulmonary resuscitation and medical devices including a defibrillator.
- Treat a range of different traumatic injuries commonly found in the workplace, both minor and major.
- Assess and monitor casualties presenting with common medical ailments in the workplace.
- Use the advised medical packs and kits recommended by the training provider to provide a high standard of casualty care.
- Extricate casualties (rescue component of course) from hazardous environments to a place of safety.

SO WHAT DOES THIS MEAN...

This is our flagship casualty care course. It follows the syllabus set down by the Faculty of Pre-hospital Care as a D grade course.

This means: **Nationally certificated non health care professional pre-hospital provider caring for patients as a secondary role e.g. Police Officers in Specialist Roles, Fire Service IEC, equivalent UKSAR trained personnel, Enhanced Community First Responder (FREC4)**
